Institute were missing four players at kick off time but such is the interest in this team that eleven players kicked off in very muddy conditions against strong opposition. In the first 5 minutes it looked as if Institute might find the Warwick Bolam A too much of a handful but after withstanding this initial pressure Institute came more into the game. Moss looked to be in fine form in the early minutes and Tony Jones was taking control in midfield. After 11 minutes Institute took a splendid lead when a long goal clearance was picked up by JOHNSON just over the half way line. He ran on with the ball and calmly placed his shot wide of the goalkeeper. This goal upset the opposition who spent the next ten minutes screaming at each other and producing no football whatsoever. Near half time MOSS pulled off a brilliant save to deny Warwick Bolam a certain goal. At half time Institute were worthy leaders and other good performances had come from Sillitoe and Colin Southgate who had stayed out on the drier wing and produced some effective runs. On one occasion a long centre from him was nearly converted by Johnson.

At half time I was a little concerned that the heavy pitch might take its toll on the players as this was only their fourth game of the season. Indeed as it turned out the Warwick Bolam manager did his stuff at half time, for immediately after the restart they produced, for ten minutes, their only really effective football.

Right from the restart we were caught out and they equalised. A long cross was headed home. The ball was not met by an Institute defender and we paid for this slip up. A minute later we were a goal behind as again a lapse in defence allowed them their chance. For a moment Warwick were not 'mouthing' and it was obvious how much better they were playing.

Institute weathered the storm and IWEDIEBO gained beautiful revenge for some undeserved criticism from his opponents about his long toe Pecks. He sent over a corner that made them look a right load of Charlies. The ball went straight into the net. 2-2. The game was fast and furious and now Warwick again broke clear. What may have been a foul on Moss allowed the ball to slither clear and it was helped on its way by a forward. Moss was in agony on the deck and the ball was hoiked clear by Sillitoe. It may or may not have crossed the line I was certainly more concerned over my goalkeeper. After some attention he just managed to resume. The goal was not awarded and one mouthy lout was booked for obscene protests. One more word from him and he was in the changing room. Moss was obviously in pain and this allowed Warwick to take a 4-2 lead. This was with 19 minutes to play. Now Institute really showed their spirit by forcing their way back into the game and upsetting the opposition into their old ways of mouthing. It reminded me of an old navy saying

" When in danger, or in doubt

run in circles, scream and shout ".

At 11.16 Barry Lee scored a great goal from fifteen yards. His angled shot flashed into the net over the despairing clutch of the keeper. Lee was turning it on now and all the time he was supported by Tony Jones in fine form. At 11.20 JOHNSON scored his second goal and the score was now 4-4. It was tragic that in the very next minute Barry Lee missed a golden opportunity of scoring when he found himself completely clear with an open goal in front of him. He took just a fraction too long over his kick and the chance was lost. As fate would have it Warwick Bolam broke clear and scored at the other end to make the score 5-4. Johnson could have equalised in the last minute and several other near misses went by before the final whistle was blown. This was a great performance by Institute. In the 2nd half Southgate was replaced by Smith who played some neat touches in the final build up.

Mason replaced Thompson who also played very well, especially in the first half. Hassell had his usual consistent game and Eaves played his best football after the incident involving Moss. He ran hard and and really got stuck into the opposition in his desire to see justice done. One incident robbed Eaves of the chance to 'grab the glory'. Their goalkeeper dropped the ball and had Eaves anticipated this he could have done a 'Kenny Dalglish'. Majek also played a fine game at left back, except for one momentary verbal lapse when he thought he had been fouled. His performances get better each game that he plays.
